

2019 Continuum of Care Summary of Project Categories

Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)

- A. Client data system required by HUD for all agencies receiving HUD funds
- B. \$101,842 renewal with \$10,577 proposed for expansion
- C. Administered by City of Winston-Salem
- D. Covers costs of software; administration by HMIS Lead Agency Michigan Coalition Against Homelessness (MCAH); and staffs cost of Local System Administrator

Coordinated Intake and Assessment (Coordinated Entry)

- A. System entry point with standardized forms and processes; required by HUD
- B. Renewal grant of \$98,115; 2 new grants totaling \$127,093 proposed by United Way
- C. Administered by United Way of Forsyth County
- D. Covers costs of staff and operations of the Community Intake Center (CIC)
- E. Last year served 369 households, of which 295 developed housing plans

Rapid Re-Housing (RRH)

- A. Short/medium-term financial assistance and services for permanent housing placement
- B. Coordinated by United Way which administers client financial assistance with case management provided by Bethesda Center, ESR, Family Services, Goodwill, and The Salvation Army
- C. Covers costs of financial assistance, case management, and housing placement services
- D. Last year served 295 homeless persons in 217 households
- E. Of 150 persons exiting rapid rehousing programs last year, 104 (69%) exited to permanent housing.

Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)

- A. Long-term rental assistance & services for disabled homeless persons and families
- B. Includes both “project-based” rental assistance — tied to the building (ESR) — and tenant-based vouchers (HAWS)
- C. Covers security deposits and permanent rental assistance
- D. Many tenants “move on” to regular Housing Authority vouchers
- E. Last year 96 persons in 92 households housed; 54 exited, 42 stayed in program
- F. Of 54 persons exiting, 40 (74%) exited to permanent housing

Rapid Response Housing

- A. 2 projects: United Way and Crossnore
- B. United Way project for unsheltered homeless who are frequent users of systems
- C. Crossnore project for unaccompanied youth to age 24
- D. Transitional housing which graduates to permanent housing using rapid rehousing

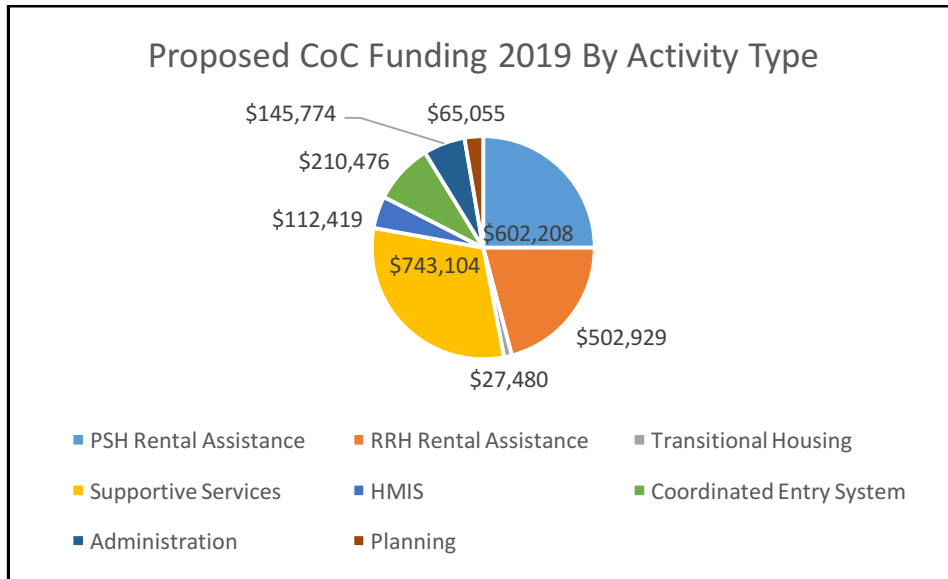
CoC Planning

- A. Grant to develop the CoC system; conduct activities to improve coordination; monitor project performance and compliance; participate in other jurisdictional planning efforts; develop and submit the CoC funding application.
